## Biography Dr. Patrick O'Callaghan

Dr. Patrick O'Callaghan is a college lecturer in law at University College Cork (UCC), Ireland. Before joining UCC in 2014, he was a senior lecturer in law at Newcastle University, UK. Dr. O'Callaghan is a graduate of UCC (BCL, LLM) and the University of Bremen (Dr. iur.). He was a wissenschaftlicher Mitarbeiter at the Centre for European Law and Politics (ZERP) at the University of Bremen from 2004 to 2007. Dr. O'Callaghan is visiting lecturer in Anglo-American legal theory at the Leuphana University Lüneburg and a member of the advisory board of the European Journal of Comparative Law and Governance. At UCC, he is currently Director of Teaching and Learning in the Faculty of Law. Dr. O'Callaghan's main areas of research are in legal theory and tort law. He is author of Refining Privacy in Tort Law (Springer, 2012) and co-editor with Professor Gert Brüggemeier and Professor Aurelia Colombi Ciacchi of Personality Rights in European Tort Law (Cambridge University Press, 2010). He is a contributor to the third edition of K. Oliphant (ed), The Law of Tort (Butterworths Common Law Series, 2014).
