Keynote speakers:

- Prof. Geo Quinot: Semi-Public Institutions and the Public-Private Law Divide

Geo Quinot is professor of Administrative Law at Stellenbosch University (South Africa). He is director of the African Public Procurement Regulation Research Unit and Co-Director of the Socio-Economic Rights and Administrative Justice Research Project. He co-edited the volume 'Public Procurement Regulation in Africa' (Cambridge University Press 2013).

- Prof. Ulrich Stelkens: Public Contracts and the Public-Private Law Divide from a Comparative Point of View

Ulrich Stelkens, is professor of German and European Administrative Law at the University of Administrative Sciences Speyer (Germany). Het co-edited the volume 'Comparative Law on Public Contracts' (Bruylant 2010).

Mark Freedland is professor of Law at the University of Oxford (UK). He is a former director of the Oxford Institute of European and Comparative Law. (Hart 2006).
